### MOE MEETING SWITCH

The meeting scheduled for Moe on Tuesday, 30 August 30 has been transferred to Pakenham to allow the Moe track further time to consolidate. Remedial works were undertaken at Moe after extensive flooding in the Gippsland region in late March affected the track's drainage system. The works were expected to take six to eight weeks to complete and test to ensure the track's integrity, but poor weather and recent heavy rains have delayed this process. Jump outs will be scheduled for Moe in September, with racing to resume at the track on Moe Cup Day, Thursday, 13 October.

### NEW CASE OF HENDRA VIRUS

A new case of Hendra Virus has been confirmed in the Gold Coast hinterland in Queensland. A horse on a property in the Currumbin Valley has tested

positive to the virus after authorities were called to a breeding property on Monday. One horse has tested positive and there is concern that two people on the property may have been exposed to the virus through contact with the horse.

Group 1 winner Albert The Fat (Magic Albert) has been transferred to the Chris Waller stable and is due to barrier trial at Warwick Farm on Friday, Albert The Fat was originally trained by Eden Petrie before transferring to Paul Messara.

First Cup Entrants Enter Quarantine

he John Moore-trained Mighty High and Silver Grecian have entered quarantine in Hong Kong to prepare for the Melbourne Spring carnival.

Mighty High (Peintre Celebre), last start winner of the Champions & Chater Cup (Gr 1) over 2400 metres, is entered for the \$2.5 million Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) on 15 October and will be entered for the \$6 million Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) before entries close on 1 September.

Four-year-old Silver Grecian (Haafhd), a Group 2 winner in England, is expected to run in the Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield on 24 September.

"We're excited to welcome John Moore back to Australia with two high-quality horses. John was last here for the 2005 Cox Plate with Super Kid and he has been eager to return with the right horse ever since," Racing Victoria's International Recruiting Officer, Leigh Jordon, said yesterday.

"Mighty High is a very talented stayer who has received big wraps from his jockey Darren Beadman who knows what it takes to be competitive in our biggest races. Mr Medici, whom Mighty High defeated in this year's Champions & Chater Cup, won the same race last year before running a terrific sixth in the Caulfield Cup so the form stacks up really well.

"Mighty High's scheduled to make his debut in the 1700-metre handicap at Caulfield on 24 September, the same day Silver Grecian lines up in the Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes.

"Silver Grecian took time to find his European form when he first arrived in Hong Kong at the end of last year, but John has a really big opinion of the horse so he must be respected."



The duo will arrive at the Werribee International Horse Centre on Tuesday, 6 September and bring with them an interesting and well credentialled travelling companion.

Moore's dual Group 1 Hong Kong Champions Mile winner Able One (Cape Cross), who won on debut in Sydney in September 2005, is returning home to Australia in the same shipment and will retire to a farm in New South Wales after completing his post arrival quarantine.

### JOCKEY DISQUALIFIED FOR SIX MONTHS

Jockey Adam Gain was suspended for six months by Racing NSW Stewards at the conclusion of an inquiry into an assault upon licenced stablehand Scott Spackman which occurred at or around 10:30pm on 5 August, on the eve of the Louth Race Club race meeting.

Evidence was taken from licenced stablehand Scott Spackman, licenced trainer Chris Heywood and from licenced jockey Adam Gain. In addition, medical reports were received detailing facial injuries suffered by Spackman including fractures, lacerations, bruising and swelling.

Gain pleaded not guilty to a charge of improper conduct under AR175(q) in that he physically assaulted Spackman. However he was found guilty of the charge and in assessing penalty Stewards took into account his prior good record, the fact that he relies on race riding for his family's sole income and also that he has sought professional help.

Waratah Thoroughbreds Buy Top Lot

he highest price in the opening session of the 2011 Arqana Deauville August Yearling Sale was €440,000 for lot 31. The colt by former Chatswood Stud shuttle sire Invincible Spirit out of the stakes placed Galileo mare Elle Galante, was offered by Lodge Park Stud and was subject to a bidding duel between Paul Makin and Michael Goodbody who was bidding on behalf of Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughrbeds. The colt will be trained in France.

The second-highest price of the opening session was for lot 94, a colt by Montjeu out of the stakes-winning mare Minaccia who was sold for €340,000 to Demi O'Byrne. O'Byrne was also the leading buyer having purchased three for a total of €770,000.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club purchased two lots in the opening session going to €210,000 for lot 81 who is a son of Shamardal. The colt is out of the unraced Danehill mare Mania who is the dam of three winners to date.

Mark Richards said afterwards: "Shamardal is a horse that is doing well in Hong Kong and so we're always interested in his progeny. I first saw this colt on Sirecam and I was impressed when I saw him at the sales.

"He is a little bit heavy and might not have appealed to everyone. But he's mature and the type to do well in Hong Kong, especially as speed is what it's all about over there and his pedigree is full of it. I was prepared to go further for him".

Their other purchase was lot 45 who cost €65,000. The colt is by Pivotal and is out of the Group 3-winning Orpen mare Gracefully.

Bahen Bloodstock purchased lot 72, a bay filly by Mizzen Mast out of the Group 3 winning Sinndar mare Louvain, for €120,000.

TAB Saddle-Up Sundays commences with the popular Mollymook Cup run at Archer Racecourse, Nowra on Sunday 23 October.



### NO PANE HAS IT ALL TO GAIN

ane In The Glass ranked as one of the best juvenile fillies in Australia last season, and she showed she has trained on with a dominant effort to win the Silver Shadow Stakes (Gr 3) over 1200m at Warwick Farm on Saturday, writes Darryl Sherer. Waited with towards the rear she was bowled over just before halfway and was then forced to come wide through the final 600m, which makes her time even more impressive. Pane In the Glass ran 1:13.42 overall which is slow but her final half of the race was very good, running her final 600m in 36.27, last 400m in 24.11 and a final 200m in 12.04. Runner-up Florentina was solid (24.34 / 12.59) while Elite Falls (5th) looked to be in the wrong place at the wrong time. She cut the corner to come through along the inside into the straight, closing out with a final 400m in 24.90 and a last 200m in 12.59.

Pinwheel enjoyed the run of the race to win the Warwick Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) and as is so often the case, this weightfor-age race developed into a tactical affair that is reflected in a moderate time. Pinwheel ran 1:25.86 overall for the 1400m. closing out with a final 600m in 37.42, last 400m in 25.02 and a last 200m in 12.79. Runner-up llovethiscity was travelling strongly into the straight but he looked to blow up in the final stages, understandable given his training setback with a foot abscess earlier in the week. Ilovethiscity ran his last 400m in 25.32 and a last 200m in 12.74, while third home Startsmeup was solid with a final 400m in 25.48 and a last 200m in 12.71 - the best in the race. Hawk Island (6th) looked to make up many lengths in the straight but the watch suggests this is possibly more an optical illusion, those in front of him slowing rather than him quickening. Hawk Island ran his last 600m in 37.66, last 400m in 25.35 and a final 200m in 13.01. Contrast that with the oft-maligned Trusting, who over-raced early when pulling his way to the front, yet he still ran his last 400m in 25.85 with a final 200m in 12.91.

In the Up and Coming Stakes (Gr 3) over 1300m, Manawanui ran out the impressive winner, clocking 1:20.09 overall. His final 600m was slow in 36.48 but he wound up strongly to run his final 400m in 24.39 and a final 200m in 12.55. Irish Times (4th) made good ground late, closing out his last 400m in 24.44 and a final 200m in 12.22. Manawanui looked very

promising against lesser opposition last season in the winter but he is clearly a horse to follow.

The other 1300m race on the card was the Toy Show Quality that was won in good style by Red Tracer, the mare running 1:19.59 overall, with a final 600m in 36.19, last 400m in 24.12 and a final 200m in 12.59. Hard to miss the run of Secret Admirer who was racing first up for 10 months but flashed home with a final 400m in 23.80 and a last 200m in 12 dead – the best closing effort of the day. Jerezana (3rd) was also solid with closing fractions of 36.11 / 24.05 & 12.36.

Skytrain ran 1:12.67 to win the Show County Quality (Listed) over 1200m and he was strongest late with a final 600m in 35.71, last 400m in 23.85 and a final 200m in 12.19. Thankgodyou'rehere (5th) missed the start and then made up good ground in the straight wide out, running his last 600m in 35.70, last 400m in 23.72 and a last 200m in 12.19.

Moonee Valley raced on a Dead track with the rail out, a pattern that normally favourS on pace runners.

Kulgrinda absolutely dominated her rivals, winning in a style that suggests she is certainly up to winning at Group level. In The Printhouse Graphics Sprint (Listed) the four-year-old Exceed And Excel mare ran 58.26 overall, closing out with a last 600m in 34.42, last 400m in 23.52 and a final 200m in 11.96 when easing down late on. Perhaps unsurprisingly these were the best final sections of the race, confirming the visual impression that came away from her rivals. Although only fifth it might pay to read a bit more into Lone Rock's final 600m in 35.30, as she was carried out wide on the track by Wilander and lost ground and some valuable momentum. Lone Rock closed out with a final 400m in 24.40 and a last 200m in 12.70 when the race was over.

Kneeling looks a filly to follow and she was strong late in the William Crockett Stakes (Listed) over 1200m. This was run fairly hard through the early stages and Kneeling found herself parked behind the leader along the inside. She picked up strongly into the straight with a final 400m in 24.20 and a last 200m in 11.95, running the 1200m in 1:11.91 overall. Runner-up Hallowell Belle was always on or near the lead and she only surrendered late on, closing out with a last 400m in 24.33 and a last 200m in 12.15. Our Miss Jones (4th) was a good effort.

She found some traffic after halfway but was winding up late on with a final 400m in 24.16 and a last 200m in 11.96.

The two three-year-old races were run in contrasting fashion with Amah Rock running 1:12.10 overall for the 1220m in the Mitchell McKenzie Stakes, but he was faster than the fillies through the last half. Amah Rock ran his final 600m in 35.56 but he really finished off with a last 400m in 23.46 and a final 200m in 11.70. Hot Spin (2nd) and Secret Hills (3rd) both worked hard early to cross from wide barriers but they were still solid at the finish with the interesting performances behind from Don'tmentionthewar (4th) and Huegill (5th). Both found themselves towards the rear and with horses in front of them, both winding up strongly at the finish, which they were entitled to after doing no work early. Don'tmentionthewar closed with a final 400m in 23.18 and a final 200m in 11.59, while Huegill ran his last 400m in 23.47 with a last 200m in 11.85. There was nothing wrong with Running Tall (6th) either, a final 400m in

23.94 and last 200m in 11.99. This looks a race to follow the form of in the future.

The final race at Moonee Valley was a 1500m Handicap featuring the reappearance of spring hopeful December Draw (Ire), and although he was beaten there look positives to take out of the run. This was run very slowly early on and developed into a sprint home which the watch confirms. The winner Philda ran 1:33.03 overall and finished off with a last 600m in 35.23, last 400m in 23.41 and final 200m in 11.78. December Draw stalked him through the last half of the race and came home with his final 600m in 35.07, last 400m in 23.32 and a final 200m in 11.70, his last final two splits run faster than Kulgrinda in the Listed sprint! Although only ninth, Green Moon ran home his final 600m in 23.55 and a last 200m in 11.86, and he could improve sharply next time out over a bit further.

# **EUROPEAN ROUND-UP**

York's Ebor Festival provides one of the major summer highlights of the European season and the quality of racing was top class as ever, despite the dead going. The Deauville meeting continues to provide Group One action throughout August, while a number of promising juveniles are now beginning to illustrate their talents.

### **OLDER HORSES**

### TWICE OVER LEADS HOME MEMORABLE JUDDMONTE ONE-TWO

A fantastic tussle between two top-class stablemates provided a rousing conclusion to this year's Juddmonte International (Gr 1, 1m2½f) on Wednesday at York. Twice Over (Observatory) fought past his six-time Group 1-winning stable companion Midday (Oasis Dream) to provide the sponsors with a first success in their race and a magnificent quinella to boot. The pair drew five lengths clear of the disappointing odds-on favourite Await The Dawn (Giant's Causeway) as Twice Over won the fourth Group 1 of his life. All roads now lead towards an attempted third consecutive victory in the Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 1m2f) for Twice Over, although the race will be staged at Ascot rather than Newmarket for the first time this year.

# ANNOUNCE PROVIDES JUDDMONTE WITH SECOND GROUP ONE QUINELLA OF THE WEEK

A truly magnificent week for leading owner/breeders Juddmonte Farms was completed with the short neck victory of Announce (Selkirk) over Falmouth Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) winner Timepiece (Zamindar) in Sunday's Prix Jean Romanet (Gr 1, 2000m) at Deauville. This was a clear career best for Andre Fabre's four year-old filly who has never before been successful above Group 3 level, although the fact that this contest is mysteriously restricted to four year-olds and above renders the race considerably less competitive than other Group 1 races at this time of year. The Prix de l'Opera (Gr 1, 2000m) on Arc Day is likely to provide a far sterner test.

### **GUTSY OPINION POLL WINS AGAIN**

Godolphin's Opinion Poll (Halling) showed his trademark tenacity to land the Lonsdale Cup (Gr 2,  $2m\frac{1}{2}f$ ) for the second consecutive year, having won the race last year while in the care of Michael Jarvis. The five year-old entire relished the rain-softened ground and fought on gallantly to deny Duncan (Dalakhani). Having won the Goodwood Cup (Gr 2, 2m) prior to this, Opinion Poll will now head to the new British Champions Long Distance Cup (Gr 3, 2m) on Champions Day at Ascot on 15 October.

### JUKEBOX JURY MAKES ALL IN STYLE AS AMERICAIN DISAPPOINTS

A canny front-running ride from Neil Callan allowed Jukebox Jury (Montjeu) to run out a ready winner of the Prix Kergorlay (Gr 2, 3000m) at Deauville on Sunday. Mark Johnston's crosschannel raider was allowed to dictate his own fractions and his rivals could not match his sprint finish thereafter, most notably last year's Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Americain (Dynaformer) who never threatened after a stumble early on. The Irish St. Leger (Gr 1, 1m6f) and the Canadian International (Gr 1, 2400m) are the next targets for the muchtravelled Jukebox Jury, while the defeated Americain, Manighar (Linamix) and Red Cadeaux (Cadeaux Genereux) are all likely to head to Melbourne.

### GREEN DESTINY TAKES STEP UP TO STAKES RACING IN HIS STRIDE

Although only producing his best on alternate starts this season, the William Haggas-trained four year-old gelding Green Destiny (Marju) has won five of his eight career starts and illustrated his significant talent with a taking success in Friday's Strensall Stakes (Gr 3, 1m1f) at York. Returning to the track where he had thrashed a large field of top quality handicappers in the John Smith's Cup (1m2f) last month, Green Destiny enjoyed the cut in the ground and looks the type who can go on to better things, bearing in mind that he had only seen a racecourse three times prior to this season.

# THREE YEAR-OLDS BLUE BUNTING WINS THIRD GROUP 1

It takes a special filly to win two Classics and then defeat elder opponents at Group 1 level, but the tough and classy Blue Bunting (Dynaformer) has achieved all of that this season with her only defeat coming in a muddling race for the Oaks (Gr 1, 1m4f) at Epsom. Confirming the form with second, third and fourth fillies from the Irish Oaks (Gr 1, 1m4f) last month, Godolphin's star three year-old increased her superiority over these rivals and held off improving older filly Vita Nova (Galileo) in the Yorkshire Oaks (Gr 1, 1m4f) on Thursday. Blue Bunting now has an array of possible targets across the globe with the St. Leger (Gr 1, 1m6f) against the colts being considered, in addition to races against her own sex in France, USA and Japan.

### MARGOT DID SHOCKS NUNTHORPE FIELD

Capping a good week for fillies by Exceed And Excel (Danehill),

Margot Did (Exceed And Excel) travelled powerfully throughout Friday's Nunthorpe Stakes (Gr 1, 5f) and registered a clear career best with her first victory in Group company. The European sprint scene lacks a champion and thus the form continues to be very muddled, but the three year-old filly showed exceptional speed on this occasion to provide jockey Hayley Turner with her second Group 1 success of the season. Michael Bell's five-furlong specialist will now head to the Prix de l'Abbaye (Gr 1, 1000m) at Longchamp on Arc Day.

### SEA MOON BLITZES VOLTIGEUR OPPONENTS

Sir Michael Stoute is not renowned for over-facing his horses, so the fact that he tasked the Juddmonte Farms' homebred colt Sea Moon (Beat Hollow) with the challenge of the Great Voltigeur Stakes (Gr 2, 1m4f) on just the fourth start of the horse's career and his first in a stakes race was a clear indication of the regard in which the horse is held. The result was a hugely impressive eight-length demolition of a strong field of improving three year-olds. The final Classic of the year, the St. Leger (Gr 1, 1m6½f), is the obvious target for the three-parts brother to the 2003 winner of the race Brian Boru (Sadler's Wells), where evidence will be forthcoming regarding whether Sea Moon's superiority is as marked as last week's race may suggest.

# TWO YEAR-OLDS DABIRSIM FAR TOO GOOD IN MORNY

Young French trainer Christophe Ferland enjoyed a clear career highlight on Sunday, as his juvenile colt Dabirsim (Hat Trick) produced a quality performance in the Prix Morny (Gr 1, 1200m) at Deauville. Unbeaten in all four starts, Dabirsim made short work of some of Europe's best sprinting two year-olds and rates the flagship horse for first-crop Kentucky-based sire Hat Trick (Sunday Silence), the only Group 1- winning son of Sunday Silence at stud outside of Japan.

### BEST TERMS SCAMPERS TO IMPRESSIVE WIN

The diminutive Best Terms (Exceed And Excel), winner of the Queen Mary Stakes (Gr 2, 5f) at Royal Ascot, returned to the track in Thursday's Lowther Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) and ran out a dominant winner despite having to concede weight to her rivals. Despite being a late-May foal, Best Terms is a most precocious filly and will be very difficult to beat in the Cheveley Park Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) next month.

### CASPAR NETSCHER GAINS REWARD FOR CONSISTENCY

An ordinary renewal of the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) at York on Friday provided the consistent Casper Netscher (Dutch Art) with an opportunity to capture a Group race which he did in fine

style. Never out of the first four in his seven career starts, the last five of which have been in stakes races, Casper Netscher galloped on strongly on the rain-softened surface. He is a second stakes winner for Cheveley Park Stud's first-crop sire Dutch Art (Medicean).

### ENTIFAADHA REMAINS UNBEATEN

The 360,000gns price tag that Entifaadha (Dansili) demanded at last year's Tattersalls October Yearling Sale is beginning to look like money well spent by Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum. The William Haggas-trained juvenile followed up an impressive winning debut at Newmarket with a gutsy victory in the Acomb Stakes (Gr 3, 7f) at York on Wednesday. The half brother to Group 1 winner Regal Parade (Pivotal) will now face sterner tests as he attempts to further climb the ladder in the top end of season two year-old contests.

### DRAGON PULSE ROARS TO FUTURITY GLORY

Several well-hyped juveniles were upstaged by Dragon Pulse (Kyllachy) in the Futurity Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) at the Curragh on Saturday. Both Dermot Weld's Riviera Poet (Footstepsinthesand) and Aidan O'Brien's David Livingston (Galileo) had looked exciting prospects on their latest starts, but Jessica Harrington's colt proved too good and connections are now considering a supplementary entry into the National Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) back at the Curragh in mid-September. Dragon Pulse's stablemate Pathfork (Distorted Humor) won these same two races last year.

### **TALWAR POWERS CLEAR**

An aggressive ride from Jimmy Fortune aboard Talwar (Acclamation) produced an impressive victory for Jeremy Noseda's two year-old colt in the Solario Stakes (Gr 3, 7f) at Sandown on Saturday. Torrential rain rendered the race a tough test in the conditions, but Talwar galloped on relentlessly to defeat his three rivals by five lengths in the style of a colt that is improving fast and should hold his own in the top end-of-season races. Talwar is helping his sire Acclamation (Royal Applause) to maintain his lead in the two year-old sire rankings.

### ELUSIVE KATE ON THE UP

English raider Elusive Kate (Elusive Quality) made all to win Saturday's Prix Du Calvados (Gr 3, 1400m) at Deauville. The winner of a Listed race at the track at the end of July, John Gosden's progressive filly has now won her last three starts and looks destined for even better things. She was a US\$70,000 purchase from the Keeneland September Yearling Sale last year and is the first foal out of a half sister to Breeders' Cup Classic (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Pleasantly Perfect (Pleasant Colony).

### DABIRSIM STREAKS HOME IN MORNY



he unbeaten Dabirsim (2 c Hat Trick – Rumored, by Royal Academy) confirmed his standing as the best juvenile in France with a dominant three-length win in Sunday's Darley Prix Morny (Gr 1) at Deauville.

Ridden for the first time by Frankie Dettori, Dabirsim was settled in midfield before coming with his challenge 400m out. Dabirsim quickened up in grand style and went past the front-running Family One (Dubai Destination) to make it four wins from as many starts. Vladimir (Kheleyf) ran on well late on to take third.

Winning jockey Frankie Dettori was riding Dabirsim for the first time and was impressed. "He's a very, very good horse with a lot

of speed and I suggested they went for the Middle Park."

Dabirsim's Morny success is the biggest so far for young French trainer Christophe Ferland, who trains at the racecourse in La Teste de Buch near Bordeaux. Ferland became the first French trainer to land the Morny since 2004 and has a Classic prospect on his hands in Dabirsim, who followed up last month's Prix de Cabourg (Gr 3) victory with an even better display.

"He's an exceptional horse and he'll go for the Middle Park as he has plenty of speed," Ferland said. "He's a very calm individual and he had a wonderful race. It's a big team effort from the owner, the present jockey and the previous jockey."

Dabirsim is by Hat Trick (Sunday Silence), winner of the Mile

Announce led home a second Group 1 one-two in a week for Khalid Abdullah when beating Timepiece in the Darley Prix

Jean Romanet at Deauville over 2000 metres on Sunday.

Maxime Guyon was content to bide his time on Announce as Lily Of The Valley set a solid pace in the five-runner field and he was some four lengths away from Timepeice into the straight but Announce came with a real flourish late on to run to Timepieice inside the final 100 metres and edge ahead in the final strides.


At the finish of the 2000 metre contest for fillies and mares. Announce (4 m Selkirk - Hachita) had a short-head to spare over Timepiece (Zamindar) with Lily Of The Valley (Galileo) two and a half lengths further back in third.

Neil Callan set a solid pace on Jukebox Jury and then was able to quicken up in the straight, powering home to defeat Kasbah Bliss (Kahyasi) by three lengths with Brigantin (Cozzene) edging out Manighar in the photo-finish for third. Race favourite Americain beat just three horses home in finishing tenth.

Trainer Mark Johnston was on hand to welcome his winner. "The plan was to make the pace, he set a strong one and kicked off the bend. He loves it here, I think he enjoys the French premiums. The plan is the Irish St Leger and the Canadian International."

"The horse is very adaptable and I just let him bowl along in front, he enjoyed it when I let him do it when he won first-time-out this season." Callan said.

Last year's winner of ths race and Melbourne Cup hero Americain was never a factor after stumbling when he left the stalls.

"The ground was too fast for him and he nearly fell on his knees coming out of the stalls and had no action afterwards." trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre said.

"He couldn't relax and they quickened brutally in the straight. You mustn't write him off as he was unfavoured by the race from start to finish and he will now go into quarantine."

Manighar is also Australia-bound, with trainer Luca Cumani saying, "It was a good run, it was set up for the winner and his target will be the Melbourne Cup."

World Treasure Rises To Challenge

rainer Tony Fung added a second Group win to his resume when the stable's star performer World Fortune (5 g Testa Rossa – Wingin' A Prayer, by Raise A Stanza) took out the Summer Sand Challenge (Mac Gr 3) over 1700 metres on Saturday's programme on the all weather surface, writes Harry Troy.

Ridden perfectly by Fausto Durso, World Fortune enjoyed the run of the race and darted clear via the rails over the final 100 metres to win by a length and a quarter from Viva Hong Kong (Lemon Drop Kid), with Victory Admiral (Pride And Glory) back in third.

Fung notched up his first Group victory with Wonderful Tiger in the Grand Lisboa Cup (Mac Gr 3) on Derby Day, and came within a neck of winning the Macau Derby (Gr 1) later in the afternoon with World Fortune just failing to catch Imabayboy on the line.

World Fortune has now won seven races on the all weather for owner Zoe Yip and close to \$3 Million HKD in prizemoney.

The now five-year-old has developed from problem barrier horse into one of Macau's top liners that is at home on any surface, but according to Fung he always felt the horse had the potential to reach the top bracket.

"I bought him as a yearling and he showed ability right from the start," Fung said. "He was a real problem at the gates early on but with time has settled down well. I will rest him now and set him for the International race in November (Macau Sand Premier Cup)."

A former jockey, Fung has done a fine job since being licensed in his own right as a trainer in November 2009.



From 397 runners to date, Fung has prepared 38 individual winners, with 25% of his starters running in the top three

spot.

Fung rode 54 winners in Hong Kong as an apprentice in the late eighties when indentured to five-times champion Brian Kan. A season in Canada followed before Fung relocated to Macau in 1990, winning 280 races before retiring at the end of the 2000 season.

Fung was granted an assistant trainer's licence in the 2001 season and was originally attached to Gordon (Bear) Benson yard. Several years as an assistant to Gary Moore followed, and in recent years Fung was attached to the combined yard of Brian Kan and Tommy Tse.
